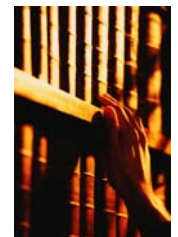

BRINGING PEOPLE TOGETHER: THE FOUR-SECTOR APPROACH

The membership of both the Board of Trustees, and of all center committees and working groups, reflects the center's guiding philosophy: that all relevant parties must be involved if the complex issues surrounding environmental policymaking are to be resolved. This philosophy, and its implementation in the Center's everyday operations, means that leading policymakers and practitioners from government, industry, environmental organizations, and academia work together to identify ways to meet the pressing environmental challenges that face the nation.

THE CENTER'S PROGRAM AREAS

Environmental Reporting. Accurate, up-to-date, and policy-relevant information is critical for sound decision making about natural resources and the environment. The Center's work in this area to date has focused on creating a blueprint for periodic, high-quality, nonpartisan reports on the condition and use of ecosystems, analogous to the familiar suite of economic indicators. *The State of the Nation's Ecosystems* (2002) identifies environmental indicators; it describes conditions and trends where possible and highlights key information gaps. Periodic updating of the report ensures its continued utility and relevance.

Global Change. In both developed and developing countries, global changes in climate, biological diversity and land use present significant challenges to policymakers. To deal with the many facets of global change, the Center is committed to developing innovative policy options based on sound information. Current considerations include acceptable concentration limits of greenhouse gases, carbon sequestration, and changes in land cover and land use.

Sustainable Oceans, Coasts, and Waterways.

Aiming to improve coastal policy and management through scientific and economic research, the program covers issues ranging from erosion hazards to dam removal to human links to coastal disasters.

CHARTER AND GOVERNANCE

Established in 1995 to carry on the work of Senator John Heinz (1938–1991), The Heinz Center is a nonpartisan, nonprofit institution dedicated to improving the scientific and economic foundation for environmental policy through multisectoral collaboration. The Center's staff is led by President Thomas E. Lovejoy, who has served as Chief Biodiversity Advisor at the World Bank, Senior Advisor to the president of the United Nations Foundation, and Assistant Secretary and Counselor at the Smithsonian Institution.
